

Bibliography on Race, Ethnicity, and Method in Political Science Compiled by Julia Lynch, University of Pennsylvania

I compiled this bibliography in early 2019 to stimulate my own thinking about the intersection between race /ethnicity and methodology in political science: how methodological choices affect the way we study racial and ethnic minorities, how our racial theories influence our methodological and epistemological choices, why racial/ethnic minorities in the profession gravitate or are pushed toward certain methods, etc. The readings listed here were suggested by my friends and colleagues in the profession, and are collected in a library connected to the public Zotero group “Readings on race, ethnicity and method in political science.” The library entries contain notes detailing who suggested the reading and for what reason.
